It is the policy of Indian Affairs to:

- Implement and maintain Environmental Management Systems (EMS) as the primary management approach for IA and school operations and activities;
- Comply with all applicable Federal, State, local and Tribal environmental laws and regulations;
- Implement sustainable practices for energy efficiency, greenhouse gas emission reduction, renewable energy, water conservation, pollution and waste minimization, recycling, reduction or elimination of use of toxic or hazardous chemicals, petroleum products—use reduction, and green purchasing among others;
- Integrate environmental, economic, and social considerations into mission activities to create sustainable, continuously improving and efficient operations.
- The Fond du Lac Ojibwe School follows all Environmental Management Systems policies and procedures and posts relevant documentation on the Bureau of Indian Education-EMS SharePoint website.
