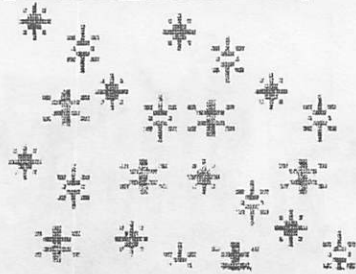

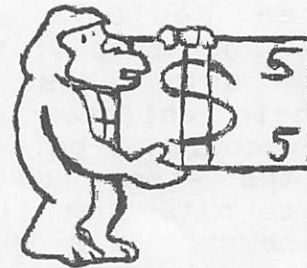

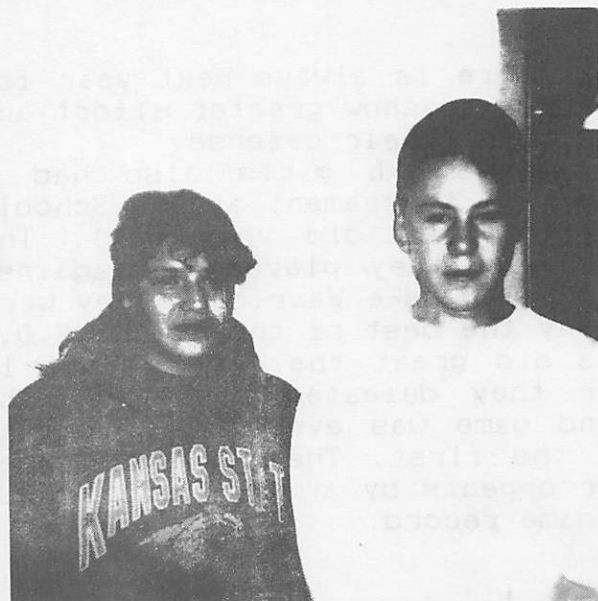
All together things went very during the week of Homecoming Week.

But there is always next year for the girls to show greater effort and to improve their defense.

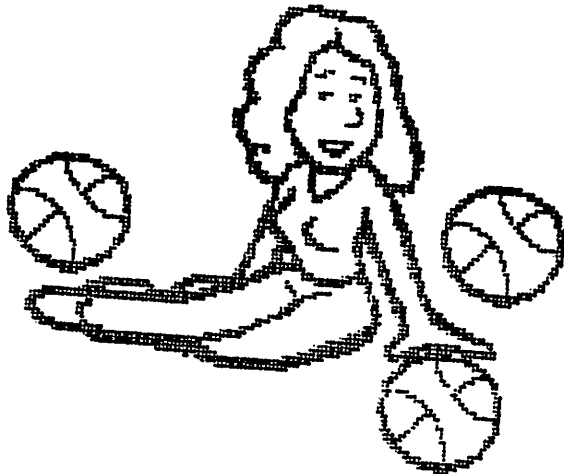

The girls wre unable to gather a team for the tournament because there were many girls who were unable to make it to school, because of the weather. There for the girls had to forfeit the tournament.



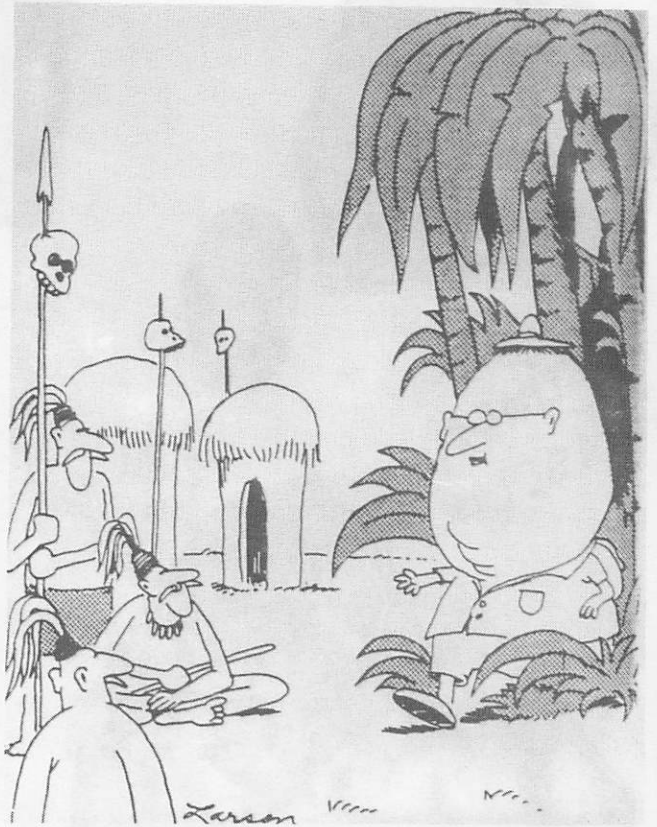


## FIRST PEOPLE IN AMERICA

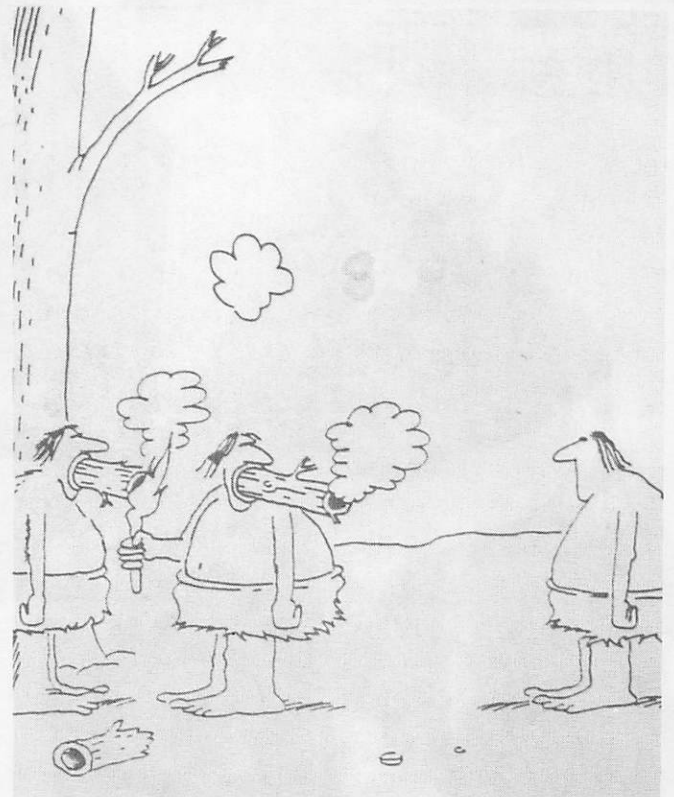

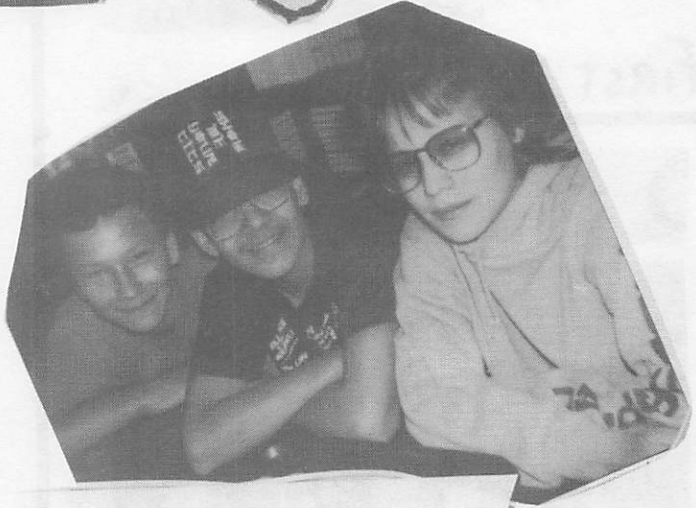

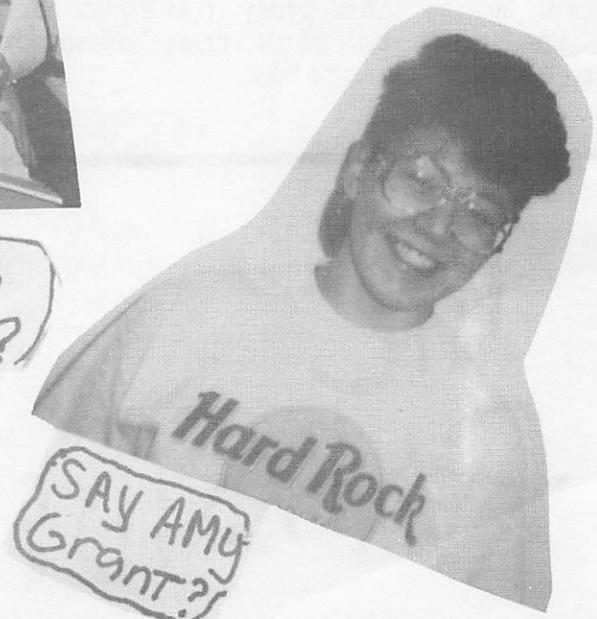
